West Virginia Immunization Requirements for New School Enterers

State law and rules¹ require that all children entering school in West Virginia for the first time in grades K-12 must show proof of immunization against diphtheria, pertussis, tetanus, polio, measles, mumps, rubella, varicella and hepatitis B unless properly medically exempted²

Measles, Mumps & Rubella (MMR)	Before admission, two doses required. First dose must be after the 1st birthday.	After one dose, student may be allowed up to 30 days to complete the series.	Doses should be a minimum of 28 days apart.

Varicella

Before admission, two doses required. First dose must be after the 1st birthday.
